Robert Duvall, Sissy Spacek, & Bill Murray). He recently completed *Joyful Noise* (starring Queen Latifah and Dolly Parton) which will be released early next year.

His wife, Lisa Rhoden Boyd, is a producer and actress with a long history of working with the award-winning Cuban-American director, Leon Ichaso (*El Cantante* and *Pinero*). She produced *Paraiso* for Leon in 2009, and served as his associate producer on *Pinero* (2001). Lisa is a native of Springfield, and graduated from MSU's very own Theatre & Dance Department.
