# A Poetry Reading by Ed Madden

Ed Madden is an associate professor of English and interim director of the Women's and Gender Studies program at the University of South Carolina. He is the author of three books of poetry: *Signals*, which won the 2007 South Carolina Poetry Book Prize; *Prodigal: Variations* (2011); and most recently, *Nest* (2014). In addition to his creative output, Madden has published numerous scholarly works, including *Tiresian Poetics: Modernism, Sexuality, and Voice 1888-2001*. He has also co-edited *Irish Studies: Geographies and Genders* with Marti Lee and *Out Loud: The Best of Rainbow Radio* with Candace Chellew-Hodge. His academic areas of specialization include late 19th- and 20th-century British and Irish poetry, Irish culture and literature, gender and sexuality, gay and lesbian literature, and creative writing. Madden received his B.A. from Harding University and earned his Ph.D. in literature from the University of Texas.
