# Missouri Core 42

- **Missouri Core Transfer Curriculum (SB 997)**
  - Lower-division courses
  - At least 42-credit hours curriculum
  - Adopted by ALL 27 Missouri public Colleges and Universities
  - Common Missouri Transfer Course numbering (MOTR numbers) and equivalency matrices
    - Required to be in catalog indicating transfer guaranteed
    - MOTR courses substitute directly and will fulfill any requirements for the major or degree as would the receiving institution's own course

# Purpose of Missouri Core 42

- Statewide General Education Transferable Curriculum
- Guarantee one-to-one transfer of General Education courses at all 27 Missouri Institutions of Higher Education (IHEs)
- Ensure statewide common college-level competencies, skills, and knowledge that all graduates possess

# Looking at Core 42 at MSU

- **Student transfers with 12 credits** (MOTR courses) required to complete the following Core 42 at MSU Requirements
- **9 cr Written and Oral Communication** (3 MSU Courses)
  - 3 cr Oral Communication (COM 115)
  - 6 credits Written Communication (ENG 110 and ENG 210; working on ENG 221)
- **9 cr Social and Behavior Sciences** (at least two different disciplines; 13 MSU Courses)
  - 3 cr must be Civics (PLS101, HST 121, or HST122)
  - 9 cr Humanities and Fine Arts (at least two different disciplines; 16 MSU Courses)
- **3 cr Mathematical Sciences** (3 MSU Courses)
- **7 cr Natural Sciences** (at least two disciplines and one containing a lab component; 25 MSU Courses)
- **5 cr any MOTR approved course**
- **42 cr TOTAL MOTR Courses**

# CORE 42 – MOTR Courses

- **11 Equivalent MOTR course MSU does not have:**
  - MOTR COMM 100, MOTR BIOL 100, MOTR GEOG 100, MOTR PHYS 001, MOTR PHYS 010, MOTR PHYS 100, MOTR PHYS 200, MOTR MATH 110, MOTR WCIV 101, MOTR WCIV 102
- **Give GEC code or create equivalent courses**
  - For Natural Sciences MOTR BIO100, GEOG100, PHYS 001, PHYS100, and PHYS 200 create separate lecture and lab numbers
  - All courses have to have lectures 3.0 credits and lab 1.0 credit (if want more out of MOTR make a recitation course that majors have to take but not counted in CORE 42).
    - **10 courses at MSU** have to separate adding 10 more numbers
  - Labs should still be concurrent or having had the lecture
  - Lectures should be allowed to be taken alone

# How is this different than the 42-Hour Block we currently have at MSU?

- Students who do not complete either the Associate of Arts or the CORE 42 **shall receive credit at a receiving institution for each MOTR course completed** at a sending institution.
- Students **shall receive full credit for all MOTR courses as prerequisites or requirements in the major.**
- Student with **12 or more transfer credits (excludes FTNC students)** **shall complete the CORE 42 at the receiving institution.**

# Why 12 credits?

## SENATE BILL NO. 997

98TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

2016

6305S.03T

- SB 997 defines Native verses non-native student

16 (4) "Native student", a student whose initial college enrollment  
17 was at an institution of higher education and who has not transferred  
18 to any other institution since that initial enrollment and who has  
19 completed no more than eleven credit hours at any other institution of  
20 higher education.



## Does the 12 credits include Dual Credit MOTR?

- MDHE – Rusty Monhollon said:  
“Our (MDHE) position at the moment is dual credit will transfer like other coursework, but the students will not be considered transfer students.”
- Student’s taking Dual Credit are currently enrolled in high school so can’t be considered a transfer student until enrolled in a college or university

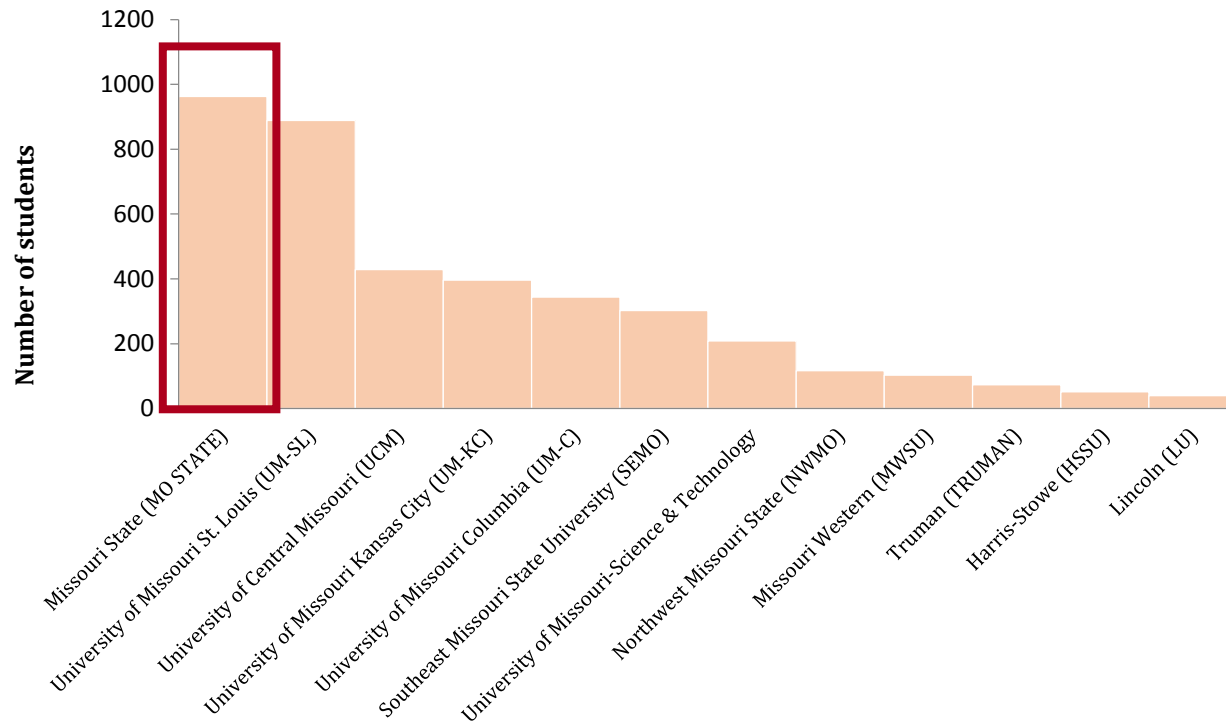


# Why is CORE 42 Important to Missouri State University?

- Missouri State University is the #1 Transfer Receiving State Institution
- 40% MSU enrollment is from Transfer Students
- Every Fall at least 30% of our incoming students are Transfer Students (anticipated 1,200-1,500 in Fall 2018)

# When does Core 42 Begin?

- All Missouri IHE will **adopt** the curriculum for **2018-2019**
  - Must have **MOTR course numbers** next to all approve courses
  - **Section on CORE 42** with links to MDHE in Catalog
- Students that **begin at MSU** and take MOTR courses in **Fall 2018** and transfer out to another Missouri IHE will have **guaranteed transfer of all MOTR courses**
- Students that **begin at MSU in Spring 2019 with 12 or more credits** will be **placed on CORE 42** (with option if MSU General Education allows to take less coursework they can switch; whichever is less coursework should be allowed)
- **Non-native student that begin Fall 2018** have not taken MOTR approved courses yet **but** if come in with 12 or more MOTR credits, **should be given option to change to CORE 42**

# Complaints (draft)

## Transfer of Course Credit Not Accepted by Receiving Institution

If an institution of higher education does not accept course credit earned by a student at another Missouri public institution of higher education, that institution shall give written notice to the student and the other institution that the transfer of the course credit is denied.

Written notification will not have to be given in the following circumstances:

1. Outside of Community College mission (upper division)
2. Remedial credits transferring to 4 year schools
3. Graduate course work (policy limited to undergraduate course work only)

Written notification must be sent within 10 working days of the denial of credit.

# Appeals (draft)

1. Three levels of appeal
  - a. Two within the institution
  - b. Final appeal to commissioner of higher education
2. The student or institution (for whom the credit was denied) has ten business days to file a complaint; begins on the receipt of notification.
3. If not resolved to student's satisfaction within 45 days, the receiving institution justifies denial to commissioner.
4. The commissioner shall make the final determination.
5. Data will be collected on disputes and disposition.
