Come join us for a free one-day conference featuring keynote speaker, Jennifer Joslin. Jennifer is the Associate Director for Content, National Academic Advising Association, and former Director of the Office of Academic Advising at the University of Oregon. She is a Past President of NACADA and a former member of the NACADA Board of Directors Jennifer is co-author, with Nancy Markee, of the 2011 NACADA Monograph Academic Advising Administration: Essential Knowledge and Skills for the 21st Century. In 2011, she was



awarded the NACADA Region 8 Advising Administrator Award which recognizes demonstrated excellence in advising administration.

The UO Office of Academic Advising serves undeclared and pre-professional students, and declared students on probation and disqualification status. Under Jennifer's leadership, OAA developed caseload advising for undeclared students, created a career ladder for its advisors, and successfully revamped the university's international student orientations to better serve incoming international students. Jennifer serves on the UO Undergraduate Council, a faculty committee that focuses on the undergraduate experience. Jennifer is the founding member of the UO All-Campus Advising Association.

Jennifer has presented four NACADA webinars since 2008: two webinars with Laura Pasquini (University North Texas) on advising, technology, and social media; working with LGBTQA students with Casey Self, Executive Director of Academic Advising at Arizona State University; and mastering advising with Assistant Provost Pat Folsom from the University of Iowa. Jennifer has written for the NACADA Journal and has written articles for Advisor Training (NACADA Monograph #9); Advising Special Populations (#17); The New Advisor Guidebook (#16); and Comprehensive Advisor Training and Development (#21).

A native Californian, Jennifer received her PhD from the University of Iowa in 2002. From 1995-2008, she was an advisor and Senior Associate Director for Training and Development at The University of Iowa.

The keynote address will be followed by lunch on your own, and afternoon breakout sessions. Afternoon breakout sessions will include topics such as Advising LGBT Students, Career Advancement for Academic Advisors, and Guidelines for Advising International Students.
