Dr. Brandon Haddock (they, them) received a Bachelor of Science in Geography (2005) and Master of Science in Geospatial Science (2007) from the department of Geography, Geology, and Planning at Missouri State University. They received their Doctorate in Geography (2016) at Kansas State University. Haddock is the current Student Services Coordinator for Intercultural Learning and Student Success and for the LGBT Resource Center in the Office of Diversity and Multicultural Student Affairs at Kansas State University. Their educational, research, and teaching emphasis has focused on human ecology, historically excluded or erased communities, attachment to rural place and space, and first-generation and non-traditional student access to educational opportunity.

Dr. Haddock is the inaugural Coordinator of the LGBT Resource Center and Student Services Coordinator in Intercultural Learning and Student Success and has developed multiple programs that focus on education and advocacy of diversity, equity, and belonging within Student Affairs and with academic colleges at Kansas State University since 2010. Additionally, Haddock has developed multicultural donor and alumni relations, scholarships, grants, and expendable endowed funding for student access.

They have been the recipient of the 2013 Campus Pride Voice in Action Leadership Award and the 2017 Division of Student Life Putting Students First Award. Currently, Dr. Haddock serves on multiple university committees that include the Presidential Commission on Religious, Spiritual, and Non-Religious Diversity and Presidential Commission on Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging. In addition, they are appointed to multiple committees that focus on student involvement, Title IX and regulatory compliance, and health and wellness.
